What is the Live Oak Clinic?

The Live Oak Clinic is an all-volunteer, non-urgent, primary healthcare facility for local residents who cannot afford private health insurance and who do not qualify for Medicare, Medicaid or CHIP. The clients' annual family income must not exceed 200 percent of the poverty level, currently defined as just over \$20,000 for a family of four. (Note: in Clute, the per capita income is \$14,008.)

The Clinic is the result of a task force of community leaders, medical practitioners and other concerned citizens who have taken on the challenge to meet the needs of the medically uninsured members of our community.

What is the need for the community?

Texas leads the nation with nearly 24%, or 5.4 million, uninsured people. Here in the greater Houston area, the uninsured rate varies by report, from 30 to 33%, the highest rate among the nation's top 10 metropolitan areas. Furthermore, the percentage of uninsured Texans has fluctuated between 20% and 25% over the last 20 years while the national average which has maintained virtually the same, around 16%. This shows a continuing trend of uninsured Texans, and the need for a solution.

The Effects

With a third of the population of our community lacking health insurance coverage and many others on Medicaid and Medicare, where government reimbursements are not covering the costs, each privately insured resident is facing an extra \$3,000 a year in premium costs.

Since the uninsured do not have a medical home, their recourse is the overburdened ER, and all residents pay the cost. The uninsured must wait for an illness to become critical before seeking medical care, resulting in escalated illness, with a constellation of chronic and acute diseases. By providing a continuity of care, Live Oak Clinic helps build a stronger, healthier community and reduces the financial demands on everyone. This is the only all volunteer clinic in the Brazosport area to exclusively serve the health needs of the uninsured.

What services are provided?

Currently the Live Oak Clinic is open three hours per week and is staffed by volunteer medical professionals and support staff. Services include:

- Primary non-urgent healthcare
- Prescription assistance
- Lab and urine tests
- Social service resources and references
- Nutrition and dental education

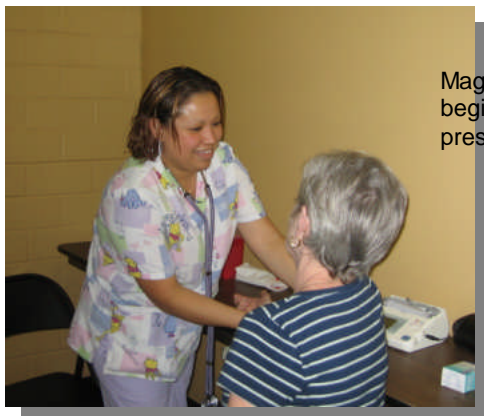

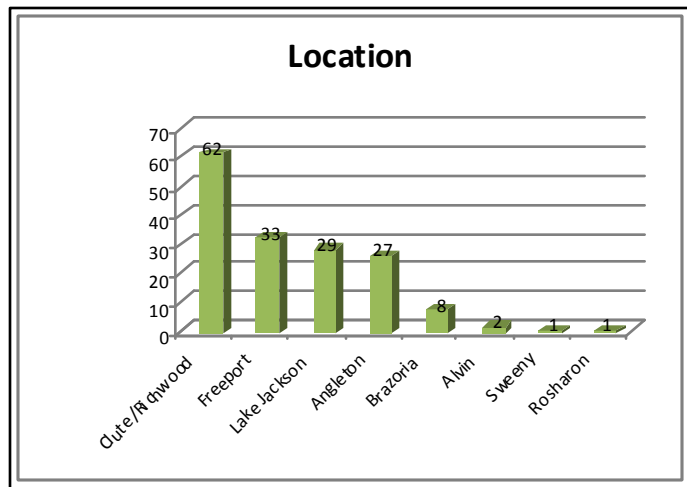
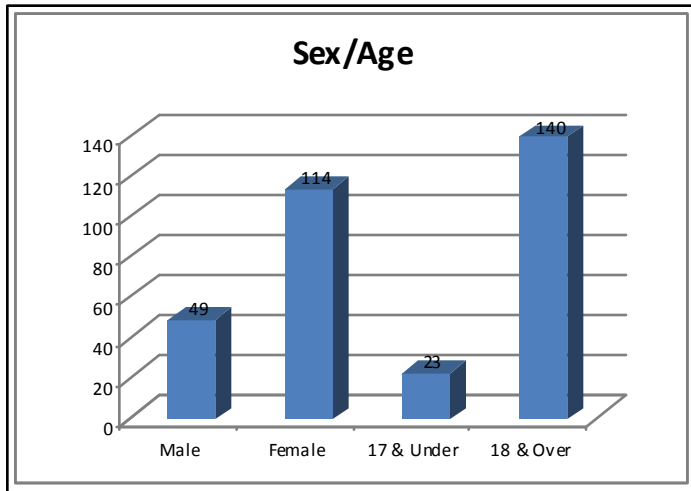
